The 'other offence' figures cover reports such as domestic incidents, all violent crime offences, all theft offences, harassment, stalking, witness intimidation and anti-social behaviour.

Following conversations with the Parish Council, the team have been targeting off road motorcycles / mopeds riding inappropriately through the estates. If you have any additional information of where these vehicles are stored or who owns them, photos of riders or evidence of actions; please send this information to OperationNeutrino@northants.pnn.police.uk

Other concerns raised are also being looked into and will be addressed using a multi-agency approach.

We continue to ask that residents who have CCTV / ring doorbell footage of any suspicious activity also make contact so the footage can be viewed in the hope of identifying those concerned. This will also help us to narrow down offence time frames and direct our patrols.

Residents are reminded that we do monitor estate social media pages, so please ensure that any concerns are reported directly to us.

The Northampton Neighbourhood Policing priorities for 1st Aug to 31st Oct are dwelling burglary, vehicle crime and nuisance; and cuckooing (the targeting of vulnerable people in their own homes).

Our team's #BlueButterfly key messages are:

We would ask that all adults work alongside us, respecting and reinforcing these simple messages to both young and older residents.

We encourage all residents to report anti-social behaviour via 101 (whether or not you need an officer to attend) as it helps us to plan our patrols and to be in the right areas at the right time.


Anti-social behaviour isn't only caused by 'young people' – if you are affected, please do let us know.

Anti-social behaviour includes but is not limited to:

- Disruptive, noisy behaviour in otherwise quiet neighbourhoods.
- Night time noise from houses or gardens, especially between 11pm & 7am.
- Threatening, drunken or 'yobbish' behaviour.
- Vandalism, graffiti and fly-posting.
- Dealing or buying drugs on the street.
- Litter and fly-tipping rubbish.
- Aggressive begging.
- Drinking in the street.
- Setting off fireworks late at night.
- Abandoning cars on the street.
